Showing that Dewey's ethics are

compatible with the rest of his philosophy, Pappas corrects the reputation of American pragmatism as a philosophy committed to skepticism and relativism.

The same general approach is taken throughout the work: the aim is to offer further support for the view that Dewey was right in emphasizing the importance of cultivating moral habits.
